Terrence Michael Paul, who was instrumental in leading efforts to establish Macomb Township Parks department and was also a founding trustee of their parks board, died Sunday, May 22 in Port Austin at the age of 56. He was born Aug. 4, 1959.

Mr. Paul was a longtime operations manager in the City of Sterling Heights Department of Public Works and also continued his active community involvement with various activities for Chippewa Valley Schools, such as serving on the Chippewa Valley Educational Foundation, which helps provide scholarships and opportunities to sponsor students to enable them to attend competitions, seminars or special programs related to their studies or interests.

He also volunteered with parent associations and could be found cheering on the Dakota High School cross country team. The Walsh College graduate loved to run and play golf.
